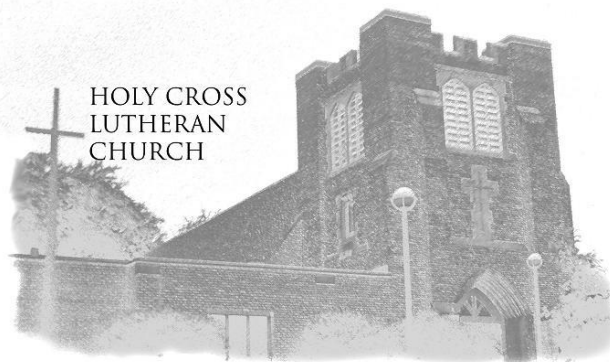

Time, Talents, and Treasures

"But if we say, 'From man,' we are afraid of the crowd. . ."

Matthew 21:26

Foolish Pharisees! They fear men more than they fear God, and so they miss out on the great blessing of knowing Jesus and His love. All our sins are like this, we fear something else more than we fear God. How foolish that is! Think of the blessings we miss when we place our fear or trust in something other than God.

"Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people producing its fruits."

Matthew 21:43

The Pharisees were not bearing fruit. Though they were faithful to the letter of the Law in keeping the Sabbath and tithing, they neglected the heart of God's will. The grace of God belongs at the center. Our giving and all our other good works flow from receiving God's grace and living in that grace on a daily basis.

'But they paid no attention and went off, one to his farm, another to his business.'

Matthew 22:5

The invitation to join God in His feast and in His work is easily ignored. The rest of life seems much more pressing, and we always think that there will be another time when we can catch up with God. But what joys are we missing when we set aside God's invitation to join Him in His plans and purposes? What inheritance are we trading for the world's bowl of pottage?

Then he said to them, "Therefore render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's."

Matthew 22:21

So what is Jesus saying? Doesn't everything belong to God? Yes, and God has a place for everything. Some of what He gives us goes to Caesar, some must come back to the work of His Church, and some goes to support the families He has given us. All belongs to God, and he has work for us to do with what He has given us in the Home, in the Church, and in Society.

"So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." **John 8:36**

Happy 500th Anniversary of the Reformation! Luther is rightly remembered as a champion of the Gospel, but he also called himself "the apostle of good works." When we're set free by the Gospel, we do good works. Jesus's blood covers over our sins so we freely stand before God as His beloved children, invited to live our lives to His glory for the good of His kingdom.

On All Saints' Eve, 1517 Martin Luther posted the Ninety-Five Theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg. So, let's hear from Luther himself on the topic of giving and stewardship:

In the Small Catechism Martin Luther gives specific Bible passages to teach Christians their duties as members of their family, society at large, and in God's family, the Church. Under the heading "What Hearers Owe Their Pastors," Luther lists three passages from the Bible of which have to do with giving to your local congregation.

"The Lord has commanded that those who preach the gospel should receive their living from the gospel". *1 Corinthians 9:14*

“Anyone who receives instruction in the word must share all good things with his instructor. Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows”.
Galatians 6:6–7

“The pastors who direct the affairs of the church well are worthy of double honor, especially whose work is preaching and teaching. For the Scripture says, ‘Do not muzzle the ox while it is treading out the grain,’ and ‘The worker deserves his wages’”. *1 Timothy 5:17–18*

Luther comments on these passages in his 1535 Lectures on Galatians, writing:

When Paul says “all good things,” this does not mean that everyone should share all his possessions with his preacher, but that he should provide for him liberally, giving as much as is needed to support his life in comfort. The apostle is so serious in advocating support for preachers that he adds a threat to his denunciation and exhortation, saying: “God is not mocked.”

People owe both respect and support to their preachers. Christ teaches the same thing in Luke 10:7: “Eating and drinking what they provide, for the laborer deserves his wages”; and Paul says elsewhere (1 Corinthians 9:13–14): “Do you not know that those who are employed in the temple service get their food from the temple, and those who serve at the altar share in the sacrificial offerings? In the same way the Lord commanded that those who proclaim the Gospel should get their living by the Gospel.” It is impossible that one man should be devoted to household duties day and night for his support and at the same time pay attention to the study of Sacred Scripture, as the teaching ministry requires. Since God has commanded and instituted this, we may with a good con-

science enjoy what is provided for the comfortable support of our lives from church properties to enable us to devote ourselves to our office. (LW 27:125–126).

Pastors are not to suffer from low wages just because they are servants of Christ and the Word. They are to share in the livelihoods of all to whom they preach the gospel and instruct in the faith, so that the Word can be proclaimed and the faith carried from one generation to the next.

I was in prison and you came to me.”

“Then those ‘sheep’ are going to say, ‘Master, what are you talking about? When did we ever see you hungry and feed you, thirsty and give you a drink? And when did we ever see you sick or in prison and come to you?’ Then the King will say, ‘I'm telling the solemn truth: Whenever you did one of these things to someone overlooked or ignored, that was

me - you did it to me.’”

Through education we become rooted in Christ, through community we become tangled together and through service to others we are branching out.

Scripture:

John 15:3-5

“Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing.”

Christ is our source, apart from Him we can do nothing. KAYLA HOEM, LCMS GEO MISSIONARY will be speaking at Holy Cross Sunday October 29.

There are 75 members of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Spain, spread throughout the country in 17 cities. The dispersed Lutherans are a result of online outreach efforts by the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Argentina some 16 years ago, when they partnered with two Spanish families to lay the foundation for a Spanish Lutheran church.

Small LCMS congregations exist in Madrid, Cartagena and Seville, where a group of people live and meet weekly in rented spaces - a hotel meeting room, an Episcopal church and a former discotheque.

Pastors David Warner and Adam Lehman are concentrating their efforts in Seville, while continuing to care for the members who are spread far and wide. They want to establish a permanent location for ministry efforts of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Spain. Doing so will provide legitimacy for Spaniards who are skeptical of yet another non-Catholic religious group entering their country.

The two have set clear priorities, which include focusing on growing congregations and providing regular theological education for the one Spanish pastor, the two seminarians and other emerging lay leaders - an effort aided by visiting pastors and professors from the LCMS and Latin America.

At the heart of their ministry, Warner and Lehman are focused on providing the Gospel in Word and Sacrament even as they begin to intentionally teach and practice the theology of mercy. Key to their outreach is the use of digital technology to proclaim the Gospel throughout Spain.

However, in this country of almost 50 million where 70 percent of the population claims to be Roman Catholic, most are Catholic in name only.

I connected with an LCMS church in 2015 while I was teaching English in Seville, Spain. I started attending their once a month services in a hotel and got to know the Spanish pastor and two American pastors. They learned about my degree in business and design, so as they started thinking about renting a space and publicizing the church, they thought of me. After going through the application process I was thrilled to receive the call to work as a GEO missionary. I'm honored by the opportunity to contribute my gifts to the growth of my church.

My role will be first to connect the people of Spain with the Gospel through marketing and communications. There are people in Seville looking for more, and I'm so excited to use my passion for design to create messages that resonate with the community and connect them to our church. Second, I will coordinate outreach activities that nourish our congregation and draw in the community. I was blessed in college to lead a small group Bible study and have a mentor, and I hope to bring similar opportunities to our congregation and community.

God has given each of us unique experiences, abilities, interests, and personalities to glorify Him through the vocations to which He calls each of us personally. I ask that you would pray for me as I work towards growing our congregation in Seville through marketing and outreach. Please pray also that God would prepare the hearts of the people in Seville.

Lord of all nations, You knit Your scattered Body together in Your Church. Thank You

for our brothers and sisters in Christ in the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Spain. Strengthen and comfort them through Your Word and Sacrament. Bless Pastors Adam Lehman and David Warner as they travel to deliver Your gifts. Provide for their needs and give them wisdom to carry out Your work in Spain. Be with the laypeople who lead when pastors are not available. May all trust in Your Word, which accomplishes that for which You have sent it forth, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.
