

Archbishop Oscar Romero

Time, Talents, Treasures

Blessed are those who can give without remembering, and take without forgetting. There's a story of a pastor who announced to his congregation, "I have good news and bad news. The good news is we have enough money to pay for our new building program. The bad news is it's still in your pockets."

"Now on the first day of the week ..."

John 20:1

All is made new by the Resurrection of Jesus! Even the day of worship has transitioned from the Old Testament's Saturday Sabbath to the Lord's Day of the New Testament. He has begun a new week for a new creation in rising from the dead as the New Adam. We are also made new in Him – a new heart, a new life, new desires, a new outlook toward God. All this comes from our Risen Lord's grace.

"Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." "
John 20:19

The peace we have in Jesus is what makes a life of good works possible. Since we know that it is Jesus who saved us, we are free to do good works not out of self-interest, but out of thanksgiving toward God and love for our neighbors.

"Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is." I John 3:2

The essence of our sanctification is becoming like our Lord. As St. John notes, this will

only be completed in the Resurrection. Until then we are called to trust His grace and to grow into His image more and more.

"I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me." John 10:14

What does it mean to know the Lord? It starts with being known by the Lord. He claims us as His own and calls us by name. Once we are His, we learn to know Him, and we learn to imitate Him. That is how the Christian life of good works and generosity grows from the Lord's grace.

"Every branch of mine that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit."

John 15:2

God is interested in the fruit that we bear in good works. Trusting in our Lord's work for us, being grafted by grace into His vine, we desire to be more like Him, to grow into His image.

Our Father in heaven sent His Son to be our savior. His atoning sacrifice is the first-fruits of all the dead, so that His perfect life and death count for all who believe in Him. He claimed us as His own children in Holy Baptism, and He sustains and strengthens our faith with His Holy Word and His Body and Blood. Since we have put on Christ, we bear good fruit. We do the good works prepared for us, which He makes known to us in His Word.

By faith and by trusting in the Word of God, we do what he says. For "without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him" Hebrews 11:6.

And so the Lord promises: "Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the first-fruits of all your produce; then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be bursting with wine" Proverbs 3:9-10.

How do we honor the Lord with the wealth that God has given us? By giving it generously to those whom the Lord has called us to love and support - our family, our society, and our church. And His promise is that in so doing, we will never lack.

That's from the Old Testament, but Jesus gives us similar promises in the New Testament. He says, at the conclusion of the parable of the talents, "For to everyone who has will more be given, and he will have an abundance" Matthew.25:29.

At the end of the parable of the dishonest manager, he says: "One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much, and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much. If then you have not been faithful in the unrighteous wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? And if you have not been faithful in that which is another's, who will give you that which is your own? No servant can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money" Luke 16:10–13.

And in His sermon on the mount, he says: "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" Matthew 6:19–21.

We have become conditioned against these promises because of their misuse, by people on TV who say you get rich by putting God in your debt. And so we miss out on the fact that God does reward faithfulness with blessings. It's not quid pro quo, but from God's grace, His divine goodness and mercy.

But our Father in heaven still loves to bless those who bless others. He loves to give to those who give freely and generously. In fact, he challenges us to challenge Him: "Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need" Malachai 3:10.

And so, while we don't give so that we would get, we do receive from the Lord in order to give, and He will bless our giving with more receiving. For "He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things" Romans 8:32?


