WE WELCOME PASTOR LAABS!

Pastor Laabs was born in West Bend, WI (north of Milwaukee). With a grandfather and two uncles who were Lutheran pastors, he felt sure from a young age that he was called to the pastoral ministry. After attending Lutheran elementary school, he continued his education at Milwaukee Lutheran High School and Concordia Milwaukee. Pastor Laabs completed college at Concordia St. Paul, with majors in Greek and Psychology.

While singing in the choir at Concordia St. Paul, he met his wife, Barbara, who is from Wayzata. Barbara graduated with a degree in Elementary Education. They were married after college and moved on to the seminary, spending one year in Ft. Wayne and transferring to St. Louis.

The St. Louis Seminary and the Synodical headquarters provided opportunities for Pastor Laabs to pursue his interest in Audio-Visual technologies, and his first Call was to the seminary as Director of Media Services. His first parish Call was to Audubon, IA; subsequent Calls were to Watertown, MN and Plato, MN.

Along with studying Greek, preparing sermons, and teaching Bible class, Pastor's favorite ministry activities include visiting with members and evangelism. He also has a heart for the unchurched and the disenfranchised. Other interests include family time, music (he grew up as a Beatles fan), biking (he's loving the bike trails here), and space and air travel (he enjoys watching the planes flying over the parsonage.)

Barbara has taught in Lutheran Schools for many years, in Watertown, Excelsior, and St. Paul. She has spent most of those years teaching at the 5th and 6th-grade level, and primarily the Language Arts subjects. Her current job is in the activities department at an assisted living home in Plymouth, which has become her second "dream job".

Pastor and Barbara are parents to three grown children: Erin (and Jim), Benjamin (and Morgan), and Andrew, who all live in the metro area. Twice a month they get together for family supper night, which sometimes involves a theme with costumes, music, and games (and Pastor usually wins.) Their family now includes a six-month-old granddaughter, Aurora, who is – of course – exceptional.

About ten years ago, Pastor and Barbara took a mission trip to Jamaica, and were captivated by the country and the various mission opportunities there. This remains a strong calling for each of them, and they continue to take teams to Jamaica to serve alongside their network of ministries there.

Pastor Laabs feels privileged to be called to serve the members of Holy Cross. It is his great desire to shepherd this flock faithfully and lovingly, to present the Scriptures truthfully, and to grow together in the Christian faith. As was stated in the sermon at his installation, "Him we proclaim."

Having a wonderful Godly new pastor is a good beginning, but, and there always seems to be a but, not much will change unless we

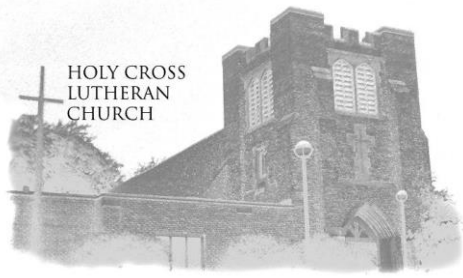

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) began in 1942 as an auxiliary of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, and Holy Cross became a member the following year.

I recently attended my 13th National Convention held in Mobile AL. I learned that since 1942 the LWML has collected over \$100,000,000 in Mites and funded projects in 76 different countries.

This year we set a goal of \$2,100,000 to fund 21 projects including clean water in Kenya and preschool education for special needs children in Detroit MI.

Here at Holy Cross we don't have an active LWML society but we have asked our entire congregation to participate in our Mite collection. We have an ingathering on the first Sunder of the even months. You have been very generous in the past and we thank you for that. I pray that you all continue your generosity and pray for the projects we will fund. I will post them on the bulletin board on the top to the stairs.

We also had many inspiring speakers including some who told us what past mission grants have accomplished. One was for Medical care for Forgotten Elderly in Haiti and a sewing center in Tanzania.

We were also told that our Mission Field is no longer "over there" – it is here in our own backyard. We can witness by showing God's Love to all. It can be as simple as a smile, a hug, a note "I'm thinking of you" or "I'll pray for you". We are all Missionaries sharing the love of Jesus to all we meet.

These Conventions are truly "Mountaintop Experiences". The next National Convention is in June 2021 in Lexington KY. On a smaller scale the MN South District Convention will be next June in Willmar. I hope that some of you will plan to attend.

This summer marks 10 years since we joined staff and began our journey of full-time ministry

with Cru. (What the heck! That went fast!) As we reflect back on this journey we are both in awe of God's faithfulness, our ministry partners' dear generosity through prayer and finances, and the ways in which we've changed as individuals.

The invitation put before us 10 years ago hasn't changed. We are committed now more than ever to bring the good news of Jesus Christ to every corner of the college campus, and raise up disciples who would go and do likewise in their sphere of influence.

We spent a little time praising God and reflecting on the work He prepared in advance for us to do, and here's a few highlights we discovered:

We've personally shared the gospel with hundreds of men and women in central Wisconsin, on the beaches and boardwalks of Panama City Beach, North Myrtle Beach, the Jersey Shore, the college campuses in Salt Lake City, Ut, and with men and women from 51 different countries in Brisbane, Australia.

We've personally discipled and sent out 85 men and women from the college campuses in central Wisconsin.

25 full-time staff have been coached and trained by us both on campus and on summer mission.

All we can say is Thank You. Thank you for joining with us to impact the world for Christ.

A highlight from our sabbatical this summer was a solo camping trip I took to hike and experience God. One of the reasons I decided to hike was to walk with God, silently, for a longer period of time. So often in life we get snippets or quick bites of time with God, but the long process of multiple hours and miles of quiet walking really allowed God to speak to me in that still small voice that 1 Kings 19 talks about. It was also a great time to reflect on everything that's happened over the past 10 years of my marriage and being on staff with Cru; as well as the years to come. It was a really refreshing few days for me. *Erick*

"You're doing good work, Courtney. And where there is good work being done, evil is close by seeking to destroy it". This was a good word I heard from the Lord on sabbatical, and something I rested in and reflected on. "Our battle isn't against flesh and blood." (Eph. 6:12) Ministry can be really hard sometimes – students walk away from Jesus, young staff can be challenging to train and develop, I feel misunderstood by my community around me, the ever changing culture really doesn't want to submit to a sovereign God and that's painful to watch, etc. But God has given me good work to do, and there is always evil seeking to kill and destroy that work. But God has conquered all, and He is good. And I'm loved by Him, and that's where my joy comes from.
